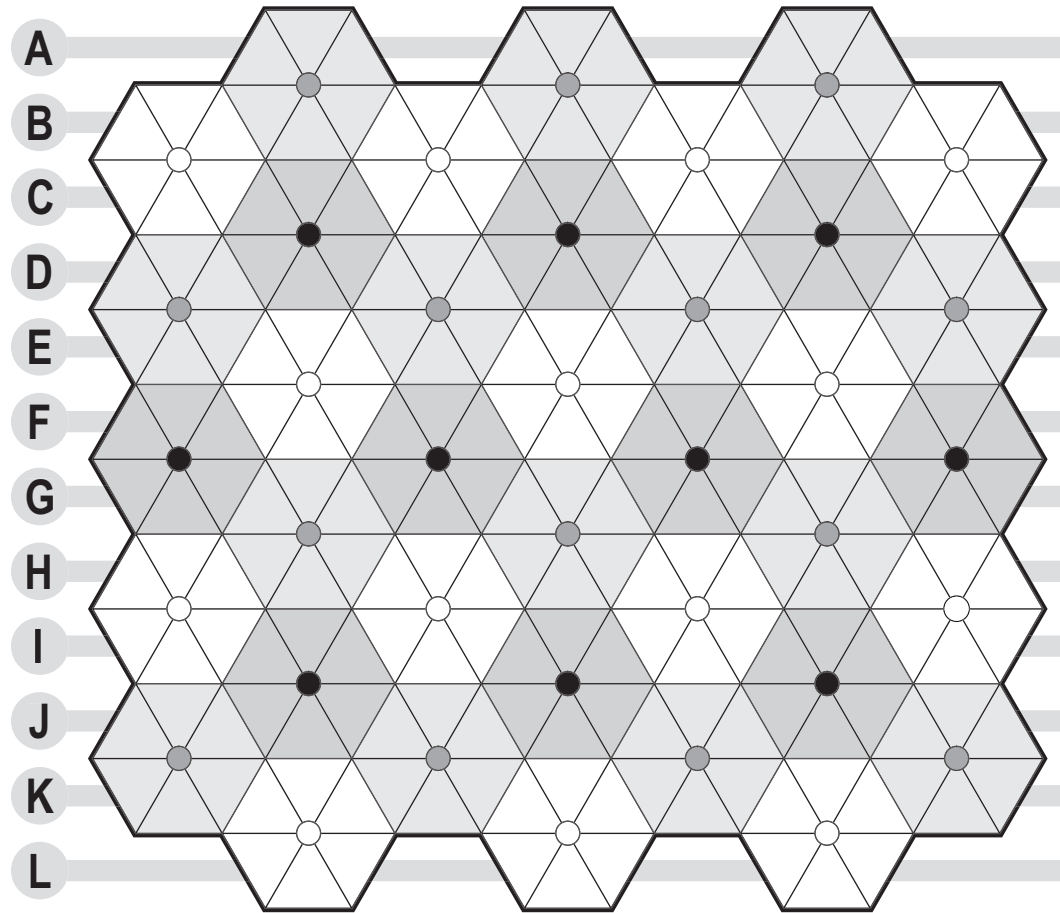


ROWS GARDEN #8

Each Row of this garden contains two answers reading from left to right (except Rows A and L, which contain one answer reading across the nine protruding spaces). Bloom clues are divided into three lists, Light, Medium, and Dark; the answers from each list should be placed in the appropriately-shaded hexagons, starting in any space and reading clockwise or counter-clockwise. All three Bloom lists are in random order, so use the Row answers to determine where to plant each Bloom.
